1. Sponsor a Christmas tree Light to Benefit UCSF Children's Hospital

UCSF Children's Hospital is the beneficiary again this year of Macy's Annual Ceremony Celebrating the lighting of an 80-foot tree in Union Square Downtown San Francisco. The tree lighting event starts at 6:00 p.m., on November 26, 2004, the day after Thanksgiving, but lights to decorate the tree and benefit the hospital are on sale now. 2. Gladstone at Mission Bay Campus Dedication

The J. David Gladstone Institutes a group of Medical Research Institutes affiliated with UCSF will dedicate its new \$76 million research facility on the morning of Monday, December 6, 2004. Located at 1650 Owens Street, just across the street from UCSF Mission Bay Campus, the six-story building brings Gladstone Investigators and staff together while also bringing them closer to the UCSF peers.

Speakers include UCSF Chancellor J. Michael Bishop, who will discuss the important relationship between Gladstone and UCSF. Tours of the facility, including scientific demonstrations on three laboratory floors will follow the program.

3. UCSF Campus Life Services

The 15th Holiday Shopping Spree will be on Wednesday, December 1, 2004 from 9:00 am to 6:00 pm on Thursday, December 2, 2004 from 8:00 am to 4:00 pm in UCSF Millberry Conference Center and Gym. Over 60 community and campus vendors will be featured in this annual shopping event in UCSF.

4. 2005 MLK Week Celebration

UCSF campus will celebrate its annual Martin Luther King Jr. Commemoration week with a series of events, including lectures, films and performance, January 18 to January 21, 2005. The theme for this year's celebration is "Remember, Celebrate, Act", making the 41st Anniversary of King's speech "I Have a Dream" speech. The Award ceremony to honor three individuals with the most prestigious MLK Award will be on Wednesday, January 19, 2005 in Cole Hall. This Award recognizes these three individuals with extraordinary leadership and inspiration in furthering the goal of achieving ethnic diversity with the UCSF community. The award recognizes individuals from each of the following groups: Faculty / Academic, Staff and Student.

5. 2005 Nominations: Chancellor's Award for the Advancement of Women

Three individuals, one faculty/academic, one staff, one student/resident/ postdoctoral scholar will be selected to receive this award at a special ceremony in the spring of 2005. Each recipient will receive \$2,000.00. Both women and men who excel in one (or more) of the following categories are eligible to be nominated:

Elevating the status of women on campus; helping to improve campus policies affecting women; participating in and assisting in the establishment of career or academic mentoring for women; contributing to the generation and dissemination of knowledge on women's health through research, teaching and retention, and upward mobility of women at UCSF.
