Student Regents Visit UCSF

Student Regents Adam Rosenthal and Maria Ledesma visited the UCSF campus on February 2. Student Regents Rosenthal and Ledesma made themselves available to students, faculty and staff to talk about issues affecting the University.

Student Regent Rosenthal is a law student at King Hall School of Law at UC Davis. He was appointed in September 2004 by the Regents to serve as the student Regent for a one-year term beginning last July. During the period September 2004 through June 2005, he served as a non-voting Regent-designate.

UCLA graduate student María Ledesma has been appointed to be the student Regent for 2006-07. She is serving as a non-voting Regent-designate from July 2005 until her term begins July 1, 2006.

Medical Center CEO Laret Presents Facilities Plan to UC Regents

Mark Laret, chief executive officer of UCSF Medical Center, outlined a two-track approach for UCSF Medical Center's long-term facilities plan that includes pursuing construction of a new children's hospital at Mission Bay and making necessary seismic repairs at Mount Zion.

New medical center facilities are needed to meet state and University seismic safety requirements and to accommodate growth in research and patient care programs.
